WATER FOR WATERLOO

Access to clean, safe water continues to transform lives in Waterloo. This year, three vital wells have been repaired and reopened – the Palmer Street Well, the Lumpa Community Well, and the Well of Hope. Each of these projects brings fresh, chlorinated water to hundreds of locals, improving health and reducing the spread of waterborne diseases such as diarrhoea.

“The installation of new pump heads by Waterloo Partnership has replaced the old rope and bucket system, which often caused contamination,” explained Alieu Mansaray, Chair of WPSL. “With these new pumps, the water is now clean, safe, and accessible for the whole community.”

These improvements not only enhance daily life but also bring renewed hope and dignity to the people of Waterloo. A heartfelt thank you to all our supporters whose generosity continues to make clean water a reality.

Gift Aid guidance
Charities can reclaim tax paid on donations made by individual taxpayers under the Gift Aid scheme. The donor must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax for a tax year (6th April to 5th April) at least equal to the tax repayment claimed on their donations by all the Charities and Community Amateur Sports Clubs (CASCs) to which the donor donates in that tax year. Other taxes such as VAT and Council tax do not qualify. If you pay income tax at the higher rate and want to receive additional tax relief, you must include all your Gift Aid donations on your self assessment tax return, or ask HMRC to adjust your tax code.
